Key Vocabulary

noun, noun phrase	A noun is the name of a thing, such as an object, a place, or a person. Nouns are often described as naming words.
statement	Statements are sentences that express a fact, idea or opinion.
exclamation	An exclamation is a statement which expresses high levels of emotion or excitement. Exclamations always begin with 'what' or 'how' and end with an exclamation mark (!).
question	A question is a type of sentence where we ask for information . It end with a question mark (?)
command	Commands are a type of sentence in which someone is being told to do something.
suffix	A suffix is a letter or group of letters that is added to the end of a word which alters its meaning and sometimes the spelling. Ment, ful and ing are suffixes.
adjective	An adjective is a word that describes a noun. Blue and big are adjectives.
adverb	An adverb is a word that describes a verb . Quickly is an adverb.
verb	A verb is a word used to describe an action , state or occurrence. Jumping and was are verbs.
apostrophe	Apostrophes are punctuation marks to show possession and contraction. E.g. Sam's or I'd.
comma	A comma is a punctuation mark that separates items in a list.
